### Landowner Objectives

1. To improve and enhance the habitat for white-tailed deer, wild turkey, cottontail rabbit and other game/non-game wildlife utilization.
2. To maintain and improve timber production in this woodland.
3. To improve vegetative diversity of native plants throughout the property.
4. To manage the property for all the attributes and opportunities that exist in a forest ecosystem including timber products management, soil and water management, wildlife management, landowner recreation, and other compatible conservation uses.
5. To remain eligible for the CAUV or other tax reduction programs.

### *General Woodland Description*


The Bingman property is located on State Route 329 in Ames Township, Athens County. The property is accessible from State Route 329 via private drive that provides access to the trail systems through the entirety of the property.

Topography is predominately steep to rolling with some nearly level areas that were used for hay production. Elevation ranges from 680 to 800 feet above mean sea level. Boundary lines are currently located with fence and occasional paint.

Property is predominately abandoned pasture fields reverting to forestland. Forested stands are mixed size classes, from sapling to large sawtimber. Autumn-olive and multiflora rose observed in stands 1, 2, 3 and 4. Ailanthus is located in stand 4. Invasive species control and monitoring will continue to be an ongoing priority.


