


Woodland Stand Map





This task should be completed for this farm to remain eligible for enrolment in either OFTL or CAUV forestry property tax reduction programs.
2024 -2034	6	<input type="checkbox"/>	<input type="checkbox"/>	10-20 ac Autumn Olive	Autumn Olive around the barn area and along the road area. This will be ongoing work for the Owners to complete over numerous years, as time allows. Begin with the fruit bearing plants first to help reduce additional seed spread.
2024 -2034	Entire Farm	<input type="checkbox"/>	<input type="checkbox"/>	N/A	Maintain road & trails into the wooded acres of the property for access.
