Road Location

The Nagy property is located at the Athens-Morgan County line along Joy Road (Athens County Road 49), which becomes Old Grade Road (Morgan County Road 4) in Morgan County. The county line is about where a small bridge crosses over a tributary stream of Joy Run/Sharps Fork. The Nagys' driveway (the last in Athens County) goes up the hill to the right (east), offering access to all upland areas. Bottomland areas are adjacent to the road and are easily accessible from there. There isn't any obstacle to managing the property for commercial timber production.



Schedule of Activities

Year	Stand	Area (Acres)	Activity	Notes
2012-2032	All	39.22	Locate and mark your property boundary lines using paint applied to trees and fence posts along the perimeter with a distance of no more than 66 feet between marks. Maintain your boundary line markings for as long as you own the property.	
2012-2017	3	14.0	Cut grapevines growing in timber-producing trees, especially walnut, cherry, and oak, but also including hickory, poplar, ash, sugar maple, persimmon, pine, etc.	
2012-2022	1 and 2	13.5	Cut grapevines growing in timber-producing trees, especially walnut, cherry, and oak, but also including hickory, poplar, ash, sugar maple, persimmon, pine, etc.	
2012-2032	All	39.22	Continue your efforts to keep autumn-olive and multiflora rose under control	
2012-2032	Wherever needed	Wherever needed	Eradicate garlic mustard by pulling and disposing of this very invasive plant species	
2012-2032	All	39.22	Be on the lookout for other non-native, invasive plant species, especially bush honeysuckle and Japanese knotweed. If you find these plants, eradicate them at the earliest opportunity. Also at the earliest opportunity: kill ailanthus in the creek bottom and anywhere else you might find it on your property.	
If desired	4 and 5	9.5	Plant more black walnut seedlings and begin training and pruning walnut trees for good timber form and quality	
At harvest time	All timber stands	30.0	Be sure to work with a professional forester and avoid high-grading your woods
