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Landowner Management Objectives

1. Manage the property for all attributes and opportunities that exist in a forest ecosystem of interest to the owner including recreation, wildlife management, soil and water management, forest protection, timber products management, and other compatible conservation uses.
2. Maintain the forest land in a productive and healthy condition for future generations. Limit the spread of non-native invasive plants, enhance forest ecosystem by planting a variety of trees, shrubs and native medicinal plants.

General Woodland Description

Athens County is located in the unglaciated hill country of southeastern Ohio. Slope and erosion hazard is the major land use limitations. Athens County is in the central hardwood forest region. Major forest types include Appalachian hardwoods, bottomland hardwoods, oak-hickory, successional, Virginia pine, and white pine plantations. Most of the woodland in Athens County is in areas of steep and very steep terrain. This is especially true for this farm.

John & Amy purchased this tract in 1991. They have spent countless hours "cleaning up" this farm. They have remodeled the farmhouse, constructed a pond, created and maintained trails, planted a variety of trees, developed a maple syrup operation, cut grapevines and worked on eradicating non-native invasive species. This property is a very diverse, actively managed ownership.

2020-2029	1	☐	☒	10+ ac	If not used for hay, consider planting all or parts with a mixture of hardwood/conifer trees & woody shrubs that are suited for site & soil conditions. Activities include site prep, species selection, plantings, seedling protective measures and tree care activities.
