In addition, there are old logging roads or skid trails that give access to the woods. There isn't any obstacle to managing the property for commercial timber production due to access.


Terrain

The Biesinger property is situated more or less in a branched cove and slopes above that cove, with high ground on the north and east and low ground through the southern part of the property where an unnamed stream flows.

About half of the property (Stand 1, 10.7 acres; Stand 4, 0.6 acres; and the homesite, approximately 8/10 of an acre) is situated on south-, west-, and southwest-facing slopes. These

2021-2027	1, 2, 3, & 5	18.3	Cut grapevines that are growing on good timber-producing and mast-bearing trees; you can leave grapevines that are growing on scrub trees for their wildlife benefits; you can also leave poison-ivy and Virginia creeper vines, as these do not harm trees	
2021-2031	1, 2, 3, & 5	18.3	If possible and if desired, harvest timber by way of a commercial timber sale; be sure to work with a good professional forester at harvest time and by all means avoid high-grading your woods	
Following a timber harvest	1, 2, 3, & 5	18.3	Follow up with non-commercial timber stand improvement (TSI); consult with a professional forester or well-qualified forest technician before proceeding
