3. This property is their home and is an active working farm.


General Woodland Description

Athens County is located in the unglaciated hill country of southeastern Ohio. Slope and erosion hazard is the major land use limitations. Seasonal wetness, droughtiness, flood hazard, and the moderately slow to very slow permeability of some soils also limit land use.

Athens County is in the central hardwood forest region. Most of the woodland in Athens County is in areas of steep and very steep terrain. This terrain is well suited to trees.

Kevin & Janelle purchased this tract in October of 2003. They had a house built and now reside on this farm. This tract is a "working" farm with fields mowed for hay. Activities in the woodlots include firewood being cut for home heating, grapevines being cut and trails throughout the farm are maintained. Stewardship of the land is practiced here daily. This farm is an Ohio Certified Tree Farm OH- 3634.



2020, 2025, 2030	All	<input checked="" type="checkbox"/>	<input type="checkbox"/>	NA	Inspect & remark any portions of property lines with paint. This task must be completed before this farm is eligible for enrolment into either OFTL or CAUV forestry property tax reduction programs.
2020 -2025	2 & 4	<input type="checkbox"/>	<input type="checkbox"/>	3ac	Work on eradicating the non-native invasive species and grapevines in these areas. Most of the non-native invasive shrubs are along the field edges.
2023-2028	5	<input type="checkbox"/>	<input type="checkbox"/>	Cover entire stand 8 ac	Work on eradicating the non-native invasive species and grapevines in these areas. Start with the more developed wooded areas and then work on the "jungle" patches as time permits.
