Landowner Objectives

1. To enroll eligible acres into Ohio Forest Tax Law.
2. To improve the productivity of the woodland through sustainable management practices and periodic timber harvests, so as to comply with OFTL.
3. To provide recreational opportunities for hunting, hiking and observing forest aesthetics.

General Woodland Description

The Glascock property is located on Coolville Ridge Road in Lodi Township, Athens County. The Glascock's purchased the property in 2010 and recently built a house and moved to the property. Much of the property was cleared and used for agriculture as recent as 1951. The majority of the cleared area has since reverted back to forestland through secondary succession. The largest and most mature timber found anywhere on the property lies in a deep ravine along the western boundary line. Here, there has been continuous forest cover for decades as a result of the rocking outcroppings and otherwise steep topography.

Old-field reversion areas tend to be dense and thick with both native and non-native shrubs and vines. In poletimber and sawtimber stands, grapevines are abundant and need to be addressed. Once grapevine control has been completed, crop tree release and cull tree removal will further enhance the growth and productivity of woodland.

The property drains north-northeast into Willow Creek, which is a tributary of the Hocking River. Elevation ranges from 760 to 960 feet above mean sea level. Boundary lines are visibly marked with blue paint.

Selling Timber While in OFTL

Before entering a timber sale agreement, or conducting other forestry work that is not listed in your activity schedule, contact your forester first to ensure compliance with your approved woodland stewardship management plan.

You should follow the schedule of activities prepared above. If the schedule is followed, it will help you reach your woodland management goals for the property including sustainable forest management through sound environmental practices.

While in OFTL you will be expected to execute practices from your management plan and maintain exterior boundary lines by clearly marking them prior to any re-inspection by the service forester.

While in OFTL and harvesting timber you must file a Notice of Intent (NOI) & Timber Harvesting Plan with the county soil & water conservation district, utilize the services of a master logger, and apply all appropriate BMP's before, during and after the harvest.
