2. Long term forest management with the intent of improving wildlife habitat


General Woodland Description

Athens County is located in the unglaciated hill country of southeastern Ohio. Slope and erosion hazard is the major land use limitations. Seasonal wetness, droughtiness, flood hazard, and the moderately slow to very slow permeability of some soils also limit land use.

Athens County is in the central hardwood forest region. Most of the woodland in Athens County is in areas of steep and very steep terrain. This terrain is well suited to trees.

This farm is located along the Hocking River, been in the family for 5 generations (1860's). The woods were harvested in 2010-2011 time period so most of the forest stands are young pole timber. Some steep slopes were not harvested and have mature trees remaining. The old skid trails will be maintained for access roads throughout the property. This wooded tract is primarily used for hunting by family and friends. An injection well site is located on this farm.


