

General Woodland Description

Property is located on the north side of State Route 691 approximately one mile south of County Road Nine. The woodland is well stocked with poletimber/small sawtimber/ medium sawtimber and widely scattered large sawtimber size trees. White oak, red & black oak, and aspen tend to be the most common tree species. Ash, poplar, and others are also found on the property. Overall health of the woodland is good. The emerald ash bore will affect ash if not already present. However, ash is a small component in the woodland. There are a few grapevines found that are having a very minimal effect on crop trees. Invasive tree species were not noticed but may be present.
