



Woodland Stand Map



This task must be completed before a farm is eligible for enrolment into either OFTL or CAUV forestry property tax reduction programs.
2024 -2029	1	<input type="checkbox"/>	<input type="checkbox"/>	8.4 ac total 2+ ac with issues	Treat identified areas of Japanese Stiltgrass. Cover the entire area looking for additional scattered patches. Treat Bush Honeysuckle/Autumn Olive/Privet around_ ridgetop area and driveway edges. This will be ongoing work for the Owners to complete over numerous years, as time allows. Begin with the fruit bearing plants first to help reduce additional seed spread.
2024-2030	Entire Farm	<input type="checkbox"/>	<input type="checkbox"/>		As time permits continue cutting the remaining scattered grapevines from all "crop" trees to help increase mast production. Concentrate on: oaks, sugar maple, cherry and poplar trees. Leave some arbors in lesser value trees like: red maples, beech, aspen and gum trees

This will be ongoing work for the Owners to complete over numerous years, as time allows. Begin with the fruit bearing plants first to help reduce additional seed spread.
2028 & 2033	Whole Property	<input checked="" type="checkbox"/>	<input type="checkbox"/>	Next Site Visit – Woodland reviews are recommended at least once every five years, and no more than ten years, based upon the date of the last actual woodland evaluation conducted by your forester
