



Woodland Stand Map



This task should be completed before this farm is eligible for enrolment into either OFTL or CAUV forestry property tax reduction programs.
2025 -2035	Entire tract	<input type="checkbox"/>	<input checked="" type="checkbox"/>	40 ac total	<i>EQIP 314 Brush Management, Woody Invasive Plant Control</i> - As time permits, pick areas to work on reducing the number of Autumn Olive and Barberry bushes from the forest area. Annually inspect areas for other non-native invasive species like Chinese Privet, Bush Honeysuckle and reduce negative impact of these plants. <i>EQIP 315 Herbaceous Weed Treatment</i> - Work on reducing populations of Japanese Stiltgrass in the understory.
2026 -2035	3,4 & 5	<input type="checkbox"/>	<input type="checkbox"/>	38 acres	<i>EQIP 314 Brush Management, Woody Invasive Plant Control</i> – Cut grapevines in these areas from “crop” trees. Leave some arbors for soft mast production for wildlife.
2025 -2035	Entire Tract	<input type="checkbox"/>	<input type="checkbox"/>	8+ acres	Maintain trails to prevent erosion. <i>EQIP 315 Herbaceous Weed Treatment</i> - Work on reducing the Japanese Stiltgrass populations in the trails and in canopy openings.
2030 & 2035	Entire Tract	<input checked="" type="checkbox"/>	<input type="checkbox"/>	Next Site Visit – Woodland reviews are recommended at least once every five years, and no more than ten years, based upon the date of the last actual woodland evaluation conducted by your forester
